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The special context of Cambodia




- April 1975 to January 1979: the Khmer Rouge regime
 - 2 million Cambodians died
 - Human, social and economic destruction
- In the 80's : the civil war
 - Consequence from the Cold War
 - A lot of refugees in camp, mainly in Thailand
- October 1991 : a peace agreement signed
 - 2 years after the fall of the Soviet Union
 - Elections supervised by United Nations in 1993









SIPAR = Soutien à l'Initiative Privée Pour l'Aide aux Réfugiés

NGO established in 1982 in France to help Cambodian refugees to integrate into French society

2 French founders : Magali Petitmengin and Bernadette Chaventon

First children library created in a refugee camp in 1989





New mission



1990: SIPAR asked to provide support to the Cambodian Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport


1992: pedagogical support in 4 Provincial Teacher Training Colleges (PPTC)

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1992 : opening of a first library for children in province as a pilot action







School library



From 1995 : 7 pilot actions become a program mainly supported by the European Union

2002: 2 major achievements in the partnership between SIPAR and the MoEYS

- 1. National Officers in charge of school libraries
- 2. Provincial Officers for implementation and management of school libraries

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2006: Extension of SIPAR intervention to the national level



School library



Between 2010 and 2012:

- A network of **230 libraries** established in Primary School
- An Office of Management of School Library Development and Librarian Training created within the DCD
- Publication and dissemination of the **Primary** school library standards

DCD: Department of Curriculum Development







Since 2009, a complementary synergy between SIPAR, SVA and Room to Read

SIPAR focused on reading for discovery

SVA focused on culture transmission

Room to Read focused on reading for academic learning





Reading For All



Real needs in terms of reading and access to Education For All:

focus on reading development in Non Formal Education Sector

Since 2000: different activities related to Reading For All launched by SIPAR

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Mobiles libraries, Centers of Education For All (CEFA), Reading corners in pediatric hospitals, prisons ...





Mobile library



2000 : creation of the mobile library program

with mobile libraries serving the suburbs of Phnom Penh and surrounding provinces

Different experiences provided to children and their family:

storytelling, free reading, games, creative activities and book loan service

Today: 8 mobile libraries providing services

to more than 100 sites





CEFA



Since 2002: creation of CEFA

Designed to act as community resource centers

In partnership with Commune Councils and the Department of Non-Formal Education of MoEYS

To provide to rural populations with a wide range of rich and various documentary resources

CEFA managed by the commune council with local volunteer staff

Hospital



2008 : creation of the first reading corner in Pediatric Hospital (pilot)

Requested by UNICEF in the National Pediatric
Hospital in Phnom Penh

Since 2009: Reading corners set up in 9 provincial hospitals

Other partnership with La Chaine de l'Espoir

in Pavilion of cardiac children of Calmette Hospital in Phnom Penh





Libraries in prisons



 Partnership with the GDP of the Ministry of Interior of Cambodia and the UNHCR

• 2011 : 4 libraries open as pilot project in prisons of Battambang, Siem Reap and Phnom Penh

2012-2014 : project to develop libraries in 26 prisons of Cambodia co-funded by European Union







Publishing



Crucial needs of books for libraries and for general public in Khmer language

Since 2000 : creation of a Publishing Program

2 main objectives:

- Creation of good quality supplementary reading materials for formal and non-formal education structures



- To support the development of the publishing sector in Cambodia





Publishing



8 different series created:

- -Picture Book, from 1 year old
- First stories, from 3 years old
- I would like to read, from 8 years old
- Discover, from 8 years old
- I can read, from 10 years old
- I would like to know, from 12 years old
- Youth Literature, from 12 years old
- Easy way to, for adult

ISISBUS Today:

- 85 titles printed in more than one million copies
 - More than 50 training sessions for graphic designers, illustrators, writers ...
